## Recycling Guidelines for “Make Your Mother Proud” Container:

Advance Disposal is proud to be apart of a new expanded recycling program for the City of Fernandina Beach.

**Remove lids and empty and clean all cans, bottles, and plastics.**

## Yard debris:

Tree limbs less than 4 feet and 6 inches in diameter, leaves, palm fronds, and grass cuttings; not to exceed 50 lbs. per item.

Must be free of any other debris such as clay, plastic, construction debris, concrete, paper, etc. and must be placed in the right-of-way in front of your own property.

Must be clear of mail boxes, utility poles, and meters, so it can be picked up from the street.

**A service charge will be applied if any yard debris is considered contaminated or tree cutting/removal by contractor.**

## Garbage and Recycle Container Pickup Guidelines:

- ❖ Place all garbage and recycling inside appropriate cart.
- ❖ Place carts curbside by 6 a.m. on collection day (no earlier than 5 p.m. the day before).
- ❖ Garbage cart – HANDLE SHOULD FACE THE ROAD.
- ❖ Recycle cart – LID SHOULD FACE THE ROAD POSITIONED ON OPPOSITE SIDE OF DRIVEWAY FROM GARBAGE CART & MAILBOX WITH 3 FEET OF CLEARANCE ON EACH SIDE AND BACK IF POSSIBLE.
- ❖ Remove carts from curbside before 6 a.m. the day after collection.

# RECYCLING BENEFITS



Recycling conserves natural resources by substituting "secondary resources" such as glass, metal, and paper for raw materials extracted from nature.



Last year, the City of Fernandina Beach received **\$2,500** from recyclable materials picked up by Advanced Disposal, and received an additional **\$6,500** from scrap metal, used oil and batteries.



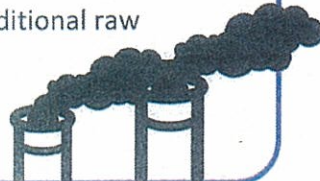
Recycling improves economic health, creating jobs in basic industries that pump resources back into the economy instead of down the drain.



Recycling **one aluminum can** saves the amount of energy to light one 100 watt bulb for **20 hours**.

Aluminum recycling uses only about 5 percent of the energy required for producing aluminum from ore.

Many recycling processes create less than half the pollution caused by traditional raw materials processing.



If every family and business recycled all recyclable materials, trash going to the landfill would be reduced by **75%** (in weight). This would also **save millions** of dollars in county landfill costs.
